Earth Celebrations' Hudson River Pageant in partnership with Manhattan Youth Downtown Community Center is an ecological parade and performance art event to raise awareness for the restoration of the Hudson River and address the climate change in New York City. 2009, is also the 400th Anniversary of Henry Hudson's and Samuel de Champlain's, exploratory voyage in 1609, which is featured as part of the pageant's celebration of the Hudson River's history. Earth Celebrations educational ecological art project engaged children, community people, and numerous schools, community centers, and organizations from February-May, to participate in our workshops , learn about the river and its species, and work with our artists-in-residence to build the puppets and costumes. In addition, the community and collaborative production assembled hundreds of artists and community organizations, who have worked together over the past year to create the the culminating Hudson River Pageant featuring giant puppets, spectacular costumes, music, dance, performances, poetry, and ceremonies, highlighting the river, and its' species, habitats, and issues. The performances are presented at the various piers and significant sites along the parade route, from Manhattan Youth on Warren Street to Gansevoort Street, in the downtown portion of the Hudson River Park.

FOSTERING ECOLOGICAL AWARENESS THROUGH THE ARTS

Earth Celebrations was founded in 1991 by theatrical pageant director Felicia Young, as a not-for-profit 501c3 organization in New York City, dedicated to fostering ecological awareness and reviving the arts at the center of community life. Earth Celebrations innovative environmental and arts programs address climate change, river restoration, and the preservation of community gardens, parks, and a healthy urban environment in New York City. Programs include: theatrical pageants, exhibitions, performances, art & ecology/puppet & costume workshops, internships, artist residencies, and partnerships with schools, community centers, and gardens. For 15 years Earth Celebrations produced the popular Rites of Spring: Procession to Save Our Gardens and Winter Pageants on the Lower East Side, which engaged over 5,000 participants annually, and led to the preservation of many of the community gardens on the Lower East Side and throughout New York City.
